## 212 Council's Insurance Policy

## 213 Holy Trinity Church, Cilcennin Churchyard

Further consideration was given to the prices received from three planning agents in respect of the preparation and submitting of a planning application for the extension to the graveyard. In view of the limited number of Members present it was **RESOLVED** to defer the matter until the next meeting.

## 214 Ceredigion County Council Aberaeron Library Consultation

Members discussed matters relating to the consultation and concern was expressed as to object to the proposal as the library and service counter are currently located in a convenient location in the centre of town and relocating the services to Penmorfa on the periphery of the town will adversely affect and not improve the service for the following reasons:

- Penmorfa is too far away to access it on foot; using the bus service involves reaching the building by way of crossing the A487 from the bus stop having to walk a fair distance without any shelter during inclement weather. It is therefore maintained that people will use their cars to access the library and service desk, thus negating any claimed reduction in the carbon footprint
- County Hall should be developed as a hub for accessing Council services in the town.
- users of the library combine their visits with shopping and social activities in the town and businesses would suffer.

For these reasons the Council believes that the number of users will fall and not increase.
