## Auditor General's report and audit opinion

I certify that I have completed the audit of the Annual Return for the year ended 31 March 2024 of **Ciliau Aeron Community Council**. My audit has been conducted on behalf of the Auditor General for Wales and in accordance with the requirements of the Public Audit (Wales) Act 2004 (the 2004 Act) and guidance issued by the Auditor General for Wales.

#### **Audit opinion: Qualified**

Except for the matters reported below in my Basis for Qualification, on the basis of my audit, in my opinion no matters have come to my attention to give cause for concern that, in any material respect, the information reported in this Annual Return:

- has not been prepared in accordance with proper practices;
- that relevant legislative and regulatory requirements have not been met;
- is not consistent with the Council's governance arrangements; and
- that the Council does not have proper arrangements in place to secure economy, efficiency and effectiveness in its use of resources.

#### **Basis of Qualification**

#### **Accounting Statement**

I am unable to conclude whether or not the Accounting Statement properly presents the Council's receipts and payments and financial position:

• It is unclear upon what basis the Council has prepared its accounts. It appears that the Council has adopted an approach that is a hybrid between the receipts and payments (cash accounts) and income and expenditure (accruals) bases of accounts.

#### Other matters and recommendations

I draw the Council's attention to the following matters and recommendations which do not affect my audit opinion but should be addressed by the Council.

#### Information required for audit

Each year we send to the Council an audit notice that specifies what information is to be provided for audit. This information should be provided in full.

Failure to provide the information or a link to where the information can be found on the Council's website means that the audit takes longer than expected and this results in additional audit fees being charged to the Council.
